- Reading through the Gospel of Luke:
 - o Monday Luke 6
 - Tuesday Luke 7
 - Wednesday Luke 8
 - o Thursday Luke 9
 - Friday Luke 10
- Week 1 Lifting Up the Lowly Luke 1 Elizabeth and Mary
 - Elizabeth was old and barren.
 - Mary was young and poor.
 - They started the story.
- In Jesus' time, women were considered inferior
 - o Philo of Alexandria women's minds couldn't understand complex ideas.
 - o Tertullian compared women to a sewer.
 - St. Augustine women only mattered in relation to men.
- In the Bible, there are only 137 women out of 1,700 people.
- Today Women are still treated as inferior.
- Luke (*only in Luke)
 - Mary and *Elizabeth.
 - *Anna the Prophetess.
 - Luke 4 Peter's Mother-in-Law.
 - o *Luke 7:11-17 heals the widow's son.
 - Luke 8:40-56 Jesus heals 2 women.
 - *Luke 13:10-17 Jesus heals the crippled woman in the synagogue.
- Luke 8:1-3
 - Names the women as followers.
 - They weren't allowed to be disciples.
 - They were among the 72 disciples in Luke 10.
 - They were at the foot of the cross in John 19:25.
- Luke 7:36-39 Jesus is the Messiah
 - She anoints Jesus and has been forgiven much.
 - She has been saved and she goes in peace.
