Luke 7:36-39, 8:1-3

- Reading through the Gospel of Luke:
 - o Monday – Luke 6
 - o Tuesday – Luke 7
 - o Wednesday – Luke 8
 - o Thursday – Luke 9
 - o Friday – Luke 10
- Week 1 - Lifting Up the Lowly – Luke 1 – Elizabeth and Mary
 - o Elizabeth was old and barren.
 - o Mary was young and poor.
 - o They started the story.
- In Jesus' time, women were considered inferior
 - o Philo of Alexandria – women's minds couldn't understand complex ideas.
 - o Tertullian – compared women to a sewer.
 - o St. Augustine – women only mattered in relation to men.
- In the Bible, there are only 137 women – out of 1,700 people.
- Today – Women are still treated as inferior.
- Luke – (*only in Luke)
 - o Mary and *Elizabeth.
 - o *Anna the Prophetess.
 - o Luke 4 – Peter's Mother-in-Law.
 - o *Luke 7:11-17 – heals the widow's son.
 - o Luke 8:40-56 – Jesus heals 2 women.
 - o *Luke 13:10-17 – Jesus heals the crippled woman in the synagogue.
- Luke 8:1-3
 - o Names the women as followers.
 - o They weren't allowed to be disciples.
 - o They were among the 72 disciples in Luke 10.
 - o They were at the foot of the cross in John 19:25.
- Luke 7:36-39 – Jesus is the Messiah
 - o She anoints Jesus and has been forgiven much.
 - o She has been saved and she goes in peace.

 - o SEE people.
 - o HEAR their story.
 - o CHANGE the world.
